

## **September 22, 2020 Town of Lebanon Annual Meeting Minutes**

Meeting was called to order by Al Tank at 7:00PM. There were 8 residents in attendance.

Motion made by Connie Laughlin, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Ed Gorman to approve minutes from April 16, 2019 annual meeting. Motion carried.

Financial report was provided. Motion made by Ed Gorman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Connie Laughlin to accept report as presented. Motion carried.

Phone request was received by Al Tank from Bill Kuehl requesting that the cemeteries receive \$500 each. Motion made by Lynn Tank, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jeff Handschke that the Town of Lebanon donate \$500 each to the three cemeteries—St. Patrick's Catholic Church Cemetery, Ruckdashel Cemetery, and Emanuel Lutheran Church Cemetery located within the township. Motion carried

Reported by Al Tank that the 2 major road projects done in 2020 are completed. The Tank Rd project turned out good. Stage Road is now done and we are considering some striping that would probably be done next spring. Madden Rd through the swamp is now also paved.

Bernie Ritchie, County Board representative, agreed that Stage Road turned out nice and he hopes to find pictures showing the before and after. He also reported that Hwy N from Manawa to Hwy O was redone, and the rest will be done over the next 2 years. The County is trying to get back onto a 17 miles per year rotation for county road projects. He reported that he is currently on the UW Extension committee and Land & Water Committee and is learning a lot about those committees' responsibilities.

Tim Wilz was not present to provide a report.

Town of Lebanon sign is in need of replacement and we hope to have a more permanent structure erected. It will probably have a stone base and we asked residents to share thoughts of what the sign should look like but nothing was received as of today.

Discussion was held on how the ATV/UTV road use is quite popular with both residents going from home to field etc and also for recreation.

Clerk Schoenrock reported election updates as far as number of ballots sent out over all of the elections held so far this year. Due to Covid19 the number of absentee ballot requests was greatly increased. A new election machine has been purchased and will be delivered in 2021. The hall is set up for the electors to travel just one direction to allow for social distancing due to Covid19.

We were eligible for a grant that would reimburse us for the additional costs and improvements that we were required to do due to COVID19. One item that we already purchased are touchless hand sanitizer and soap dispensers.

Motion was made to adjourn by Ed Gorman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Connie Laughlin. Meeting adjourned at 7:29PM.
